MEASLES

A highly contagious viral infection







Measles is six times more contagious than flu!

Children under the age of 10 have the highest risk of contracting the disease.

30% of those infected are at risk of **complications** that can lead to hospitalisation.



Persons **not immunised** against measles, persons with **impaired immunity**, **pregnant women** and children **under 12 months of age** are **most at risk of complications** from measles.

Vaccination = protection

A vaccination with two doses of the MMR vaccine (mumps-measles-rubella) is the only effective protection against the disease. Check your vaccination status and that of your family: if the status is incomplete or if you have any doubts, contact your general practitioner.



In case of symptoms

- Contact your general practitioner BEFORE you go to the consultation.
- Wear a mask when going to the consultation.
- **Avoid contact** with others, especially unvaccinated or vulnerable persons (pregnant women, infants, etc.).
- Wait for your general practitioner's permission before resuming your activities.











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
